### **DISTRICT RIDER EDUCATION:**



RIDER EDUCATION NEWS ----- **SAFETY IS F  
OR LIFE** --- John Steele, PA. District Educator.  
***Ride Safe and Enjoy.***

The yellow school buses are out and about so school must have started. Watch for kids and do not pass a school bus inappropriately. But the school busses also mean that a lot of parents are out and about in a big hurry taking the kids to their extra activities. Many are on their cell phones explaining to someone why they are running late. Are they watching alertly for motorcycles – I don't think so. School busses also mean the leaves will be falling shortly.

Wet leaves are as slippery a ice – be cautious. Remember that white traffic line markers, especially stop lines and turn arrows, are just as slippery when wet. With the arrival of fall comes cooler weather. In the summer a storm may drop the temperature from 90 to 70 degrees. In the fall a storm may drop the temperature from 75 to 55. Always carry extra clothing – hypothermia is a nasty thing. Dropping temperatures will also cause your tire pressure to drop. This is the time you really need to keep checking. Low tire pressure is the single biggest cause of hydroplaning – another nasty thing on two wheels.

motorcycle? The LoJack Early Warning Recovery System notifies you directly if your bike is moved without your authorization. LoJack will alert you by phone, e-mail and/or pager so you can quickly check on the status of your motorcycle. If a theft has occurred, the LoJack Early Warning Recovery System enables the police to track and recover your bike even sooner. The LoJack system is recommended by several Insurance Companies. 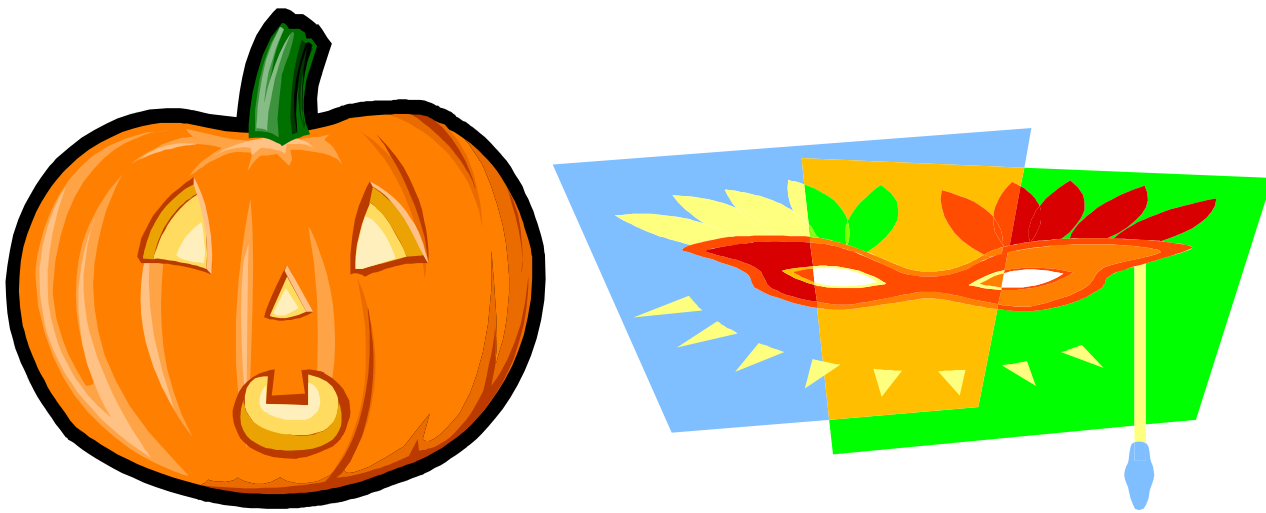
As you consider building your team, look at each person carefully and ask yourself some questions.

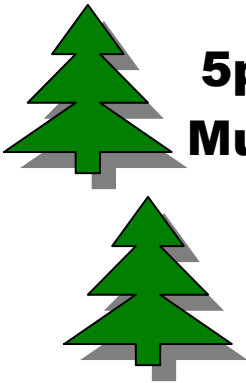
